The Kinder Garden is aware there are a lot of plants that are poisonous or capable of causing highly allergic reaction. The service's aim is to minimise the risk to children in relation to hazardous plants. The service where possible will gain professional advice when installing landscaping or new plants at the service.

Implementation

The Approved Provider/Nominated Supervisor of the service will ensure that any vegetation in the children's play area is identified and maintained to ensure that it does not present a hazard to the children.

To minimise the risk the service will:

- Remove all poisonous plants.
- Make available to all educators and other staff the latest information on poisonous plants.
- Supervise children at all time around plants.
- Teach children not to eat anything straight from a bush or plant.
- Keep the Poison Information phone number **13 11 26** near the phone.

Symptoms of poisoning:

- Vomiting
- Stomach cramps
- Burning to the mouth
- Irregular heart beat
- Convulsions

First Aid:

- Ring Poison Information Line **13 11 26**
- Call **000** if child is having difficulty breathing, is unconscious or having a seizure.

The Approved Provide/Nominated Supervisor will ensure that this policy in maintained and implemented at all times.
